


Given the opportunity to go back to 1991, I would first and foremost tell my dad how much I love him and give hugs to him, my living grandparents, and friends who have passed. I would ask the questions I didn't realize I should have asked nearly 30 years ago before illnesses take people away from us. I would learn how to cook some of the dishes my family made. I would travel more without fear and soak in as many memories as possible.

Even though I may have made missteps along the way, ultimately, though, I wouldn't want to make different decisions. Everything that has happened has brought me to this very spot. I wrestled with life's challenges, gained wisdom through life's lessons, and found my authentic self through the journey. In the past decades, I connected with many people, and I feel blessed by many of these relationships. I wouldn't want to change any of that as the various paths I've taken have led to this particular time and space.

We know that making one little change along the way would impact the time-space continuum — or we know that's how it is in movies like *Back to the Future*. I wouldn't have met Steph or had my children if one of the little paths were different. For all of these reasons, I wouldn't tell myself to change one thing — except to better recognize my worth as a child of God sooner than I did.

FINANCIAL NEWS

Unfortunately, after closing the books for April, we are seeing red figures for the second straight month. Our giving was up slightly from March, but the expenses went down. Why did the expenses go down? Twice a year we are faced with three payrolls coming in the same month; March was one of those months. April had only two payrolls, so we are back to a more "normal" situation. The good news is that we are in a much better position than 2023. Last year at this time we were in the red by more than \$54,000, so this smaller deficit is encouraging.

I am proud to announce that we have surpassed the goal of \$54,000 in the "FIX THE ROOF" campaign. We have received more than \$56,000, and there are still donations coming in! This congregation has a strong CAN-DO attitude. I know that some members donated over an extended period; they could not donate all at once but wanted to participate. This is wondeful! Because we exceeded our goal, we'll be able to put some of these donations toward the tree removal, which will help our bottom line. Repairs are still ongoing and should be completed during the summer, hopefully about the same time as the street and sewer projects are finally finished. Kudos to all for walking extra steps each Sunday due to the lack of parking near the church!

Recently, we had a seminar presented by Julia Frisbie, Executive Director of Faith Foundation Northwest, titled, "WAYS TO GIVE WORKSHOP." A great number of our members are at the point in their life when they need to make decisions about their legacy. I remain optimistic about our church in general and our finances in particular. 


THE BOOK NOOK

"Mei Guo." Beautiful Country. America!

Qian Julie Wang and her mother land at JFK Airport in 1994 with visitor visas that will soon expire. She is seven years old, and is reuniting with her father, who had made this journey two years earlier. At last they would be together again in this Beautiful Country, and life could return to normal. Or so she thought.



For the next few years, this family would live in the shadows, avoiding the attention of anyone in authority, including doctors, policemen, work supervisors, and even land lords. They would work hard to stay under the radar, never making waves, never asserting their wishes, never complaining. Qian's parents had been professors in China; now they would work in sweatshops, scraping by on pitiful wages. The effects of extreme poverty would overwhelm the family tension, illness, hunger, and insecurity.

This memoir tells the story of constant immigrant fears, family stress, language difficulties, inadequate housing, and a lonely girl growing up much too quickly, determined to carry the weight of her parents' difficulties and smooth over the tension that has taken up residence in their lives. It is also a story of love, devotion, and perseverance.

As a bright, determined girl, Qian ignores her parents' mantra not to draw attention to herself. She finds ways to succeed, to prove her intelligence to doubting school personnel, to exceed everyone's expectations, and to make a way in this strange new country that isn't at all what she expected.

This book is available on the United Women in Faith book kiosk in the Family Life Center.

UNITED WOMEN IN FAITH

In May, I completed a 4-year term as Program Advisory Group member to the Board of Directors of the National United Women in Faith. Part of my final days on that board were spent in Anchorage, Alaska, visiting one of the National Mission Institutions (NMI) of UWFaith. I was able to tour and support a project at AK Child and Family Service, an NMI since 1890. It was originally founded under the name Jesse Lee Home, a Methodist Mission in Unalaska. In 1925 it was moved to Seward, Alaska, and in 1964, following the devastating earthquake, the United Methodist Women purchased 25 acres in Anchorage where the home now resides.

This organization acknowledges the historical damage caused to the native cultures and is striving to make amends. Our United Women in Faith Pledge to Mission monies support this amazing institution that provides multiple programs for youth diagnosed with emotional and behavioral problem. And this is just one of 89 National Mission Institutions doing amazing work!


