PASTOR MIKE'S MUSINGS

Dear Warm Heart Friends and Family:

This is just a heads up.

The Book of Discipline of the United Methodist Church allows pastors to request a formational and spiritual growth leave of up to six months while continuing to hold an appointment in the local church.

At the pressing of our District Superintendent, I will be requesting a short renewal leave next summer, 2026. I will not be taking six months, or even 3 months as our DS wanted. But I will take a leave for 9 weeks beginning Monday, May 25th and returning to the office on Monday, July 27th. This summer time leave will have the least amount of impact on the local church, compared to other times in the calendar year.

While it is allowable to take several months of leave every six to seven years of ministry, I have never taken a leave or a Sabbatical in what will be 28 years of continual full-time ministry over six church appointments.

Over these nine weeks next summer, our church will have the opportunity to hear other speakers and foster church leadership. The Conference may assist in pulpit supply and other areas of need. I know there will be a lot of questions about how ministry will get done - but we have a year to plan and prepare. We are also blessed with several retired clergy in our midst.

My plans are yet to be made for the renewal leave, but I do know it will start with a week in Hawaii for a multi-family vacation, and a probable week in Washington DC to tour our nation's sites. I also plan to visit as many churches as I can on these adventures.

Thank you to our Staff Parish team and Administrative Council for approving this leave. You truly are the Church of the Warm Heart!

P.S. If you've been attending the Church of the Warm Heart for a while and are interested in becoming a member, I have great news! We will be having a new members class on August 24th after second service (about 12:30 p.m.). If the word "class" sounds intimidating, don't worry! It's a very casual gathering (with pizza!) where we'll get to know each other and I'll share with you the history of our church family, both locally and around the world. But what if you're already a member of the church? You have a role in this process too! In the coming months, you can expect one or more of our services to include a liturgical time when new members are introduced and they affirm their vows (fear not prospective new members, I do almost all the talking). And one of my favorite parts of this liturgy is that it includes vows that currently members make to those joining our fold. Here's that promise:

We give thanks for all that God has already given you and we welcome you in Christian love.

As members together with you in the body of Christ and in this congregation of the United Methodist Church, we renew our covenant faithfully to participate in the ministries of the church by our prayers, our presence, our gifts, our service, and our witness; that in everything, God may be glorified through Jesus Christ.

This winter, we'll also be holding a Confirmation class for our 7-9th grade students, where they will learn in depth about the Christian faith, church history, and Methodist theology. At the end of their class, these students will also have the opportunity to join the church, and we'll make our congregational vows to them as well.

What does it mean to YOU to participate in the ministries of the church by your prayers, presence, gifts, service, and witness, so that God may be glorified in everything we do? How can you live out your promise to participate along with our new members and build them up in love along the way? Every time someone is baptized or joins the church, we have a wonderful opportunity to re-examine our own vows and step up in the way we live them. I hope you'll take that opportunity many times this year.

FAMILY MINISTRIES

If you're not knee-deep in school supplies, is it even August? I'm enjoying managing donations to our School Supply Drive and packing supplies up for various kids and families as part of my new role of Family Minister. It's always wonderful to be able to support families in the church and community as their children gear up for a new school year, and the relief on people's faces is palpable when we are able to step in and ease the financial burden of that start-up. Not a bad start as we head into the summer vacation period. June was almost a break-even situation as we were only \$1,356 behind. For the year, we find ourselves down \$22,442 which is much better than the last two years (deficits of \$73,096 in 2023 and \$40,048 in 2024). So, a really positive start as we begin August! But please remain faithful in your giving. For whatever reason, August has historically been a tough month regarding our finances. In 2024, we were short a whopping \$26,599 in August, and it was at that time that I started losing sleep with worry. I am afraid we could be seeing a similar situation this summer, as August is a three-payroll month. I am praying that this August will be a better month for giving as the expenses are a constant. Please pray with me for positive results regarding our finances.

Of course there are many reasons to be full of hope for our church. We continue to grow in attendance as prospective members are evident every Sunday. Our encompassing friendly nature and welcoming attitude is the main reason that new members give for becoming a regular at the Church of the Warm Heart. I always believe if we can continue to expose prospects to our services with our outstanding music, great preaching, and our welcoming attitude, they will come back. So keep up the good work.

When was the last time you considered all the things our giving to the general fund supports? Here are just a few to get you thinking:

- Keeps the building lights and AC on so we can have comfortable services
- Our pastor and staff are paid so they can focus on their ministry rather than how to make rent
- Dozens of small groups are supported and empowered
- Families are blessed by our children and youth programs

It is almost time for schools to reopen. An exciting time to say the least. The choir will be back to inspire us each Sunday, new sermon series will be in place, and football season is here. (Of course I could not pass up a chance to highlight my favorite time of the year). 


THE BOOK NOOK

Black Was the Ink, by Michelle Coles, has it all — a coming of age story, a history lesson, time travel, family bonds, and an attic with a ghost!

City boy Malcolm, born and raised in Washington D.C., goes to Mississippi to spend the summer with his great aunt and uncle on



their farm. While trying to cope with outdoor chores, no internet, no shopping malls, and a surly Uncle Leroy, Malcolm also discovers cousins he's never met, the joys of large, Southern-family gatherings, an attic hideaway perfect for drawing, and a cute neighbor girl.

The farm, which has been in Malcolm's family for generations, is soon to be taken by the highway department for a road-widening project. This fact casts a pall over Aunt Carol's summer, but she is determined to make the most of their last few months of country living, particularly with the addition of Malcolm from "up north." Malcolm, who knows little about family history or history in general, is drawn into a series of time-travel adventures, orchestrated by the ghost of Cedric Johnson, the ancestor who originally purchased the farm. 
