Dear friends and family of Meridian UMC:

No, your pastor didn't email you.

I know that sounds negative, but summer is the season of scammers and tricksters.

In the past few months, there has been an uptick in my colleagues reporting that their churches have been hit by scammers. When it comes to churches and other non-profits, fraudsters are most eager to take advantage of the benevolence and trusting nature of those involved. One friend in a former church lost over \$100K in these types of scams!


Unfortunately, a lot of our contact information is online. Fraudsters can hack into our accounts (or create like-named accounts) and solicit from our congregations.

YOUR PASTOR WILL NOT ASK YOU TO BUY GIFT CARDS AND EMAIL BACK THE CODES AND PIN. We might ask for gift cards (in the newsletter or announcements) to give out for help or for the holidays - but we will not covertly send you a message asking for you to buy a \$100 Target gift card and send back the numbers.

Also, your pastor was not abducted, and is not stranded in a foreign country in desperate need of your bail money to get back into the states. I also won't send random texts asking "Are you available right now for a confidential conversation?"

A year ago, I had a wedding couple (whom I had only conversed with online) send me a check for \$2,000 (by mistake, they said). They asked me to send back a check for \$1,900 to refund their check. Of course it was a scam - I didn't even try to cash the \$2,000 or send them \$1,900. Funny, there was no wedding...

Please be careful out there. Be very skeptical of any giving requests you receive online through email or social media. While the request may look like it is coming from an official source, it may not be real, as it may be the result of a hacked or spoofed account. Your best defense against fraudulent email is a healthy amount of skepticism - and if in doubt, contact the church office (don't respond back on the email link).



Online fraud is a frustrating and disappointing part of life today. It is pervasive in part because of its success in capitalizing on good and generous people. Let's do what we can to protect our flock from these cyber-threats.

No, your pastor didn't email you - although I see the irony in sending this out in a newsletter. And if I am stuck in a foreign country asking for bail money, could someone please inform my wife? I might have a lot of explaining to do!





After the books were closed for April, we found ourselves in a negative position of \$29,852. Giving has been consistent this year, but expenses continue to increase. Please do not be discouraged by the above figures. To streamline our payroll system, we changed to paying our staff every two weeks instead of twice monthly. During the month of April, we had three paydays, which increased our payroll by \$19,000. This should even out over the course of the year. I have been told that listing the last three years' figures was helpful, so I have included the figures for the first four months of the last three years.

We are beginning to reestablish a "normal" Sunday morning worship service. It is encouraging to see an almost full sanctuary, plates being passed, and masks optional. We can only hope our numbers continue to increase in attendance and giving. I do feel that expenses will continue to rise due to inflation. About this time of the year, as we head into the summer months and the travel season, I begin to worry about falling behind each month. Even though we have lost more than one hundred givers since 2020, we are gaining new members who are giving on a consistent basis. Families will have tough decisions on vacations with the ever-increasing inflation. I would remind you that you can still stay connected to your church family by watching our services and Bible study online, even if you are out of town.



THE BOOK NOOK

Sometimes you come across a book that fills you with hope, calms your troubled soul, and points you to a higher way of living. Bishop Michael Curry's book, Love Is the Way: Holding onto Hope in Troubling Times, is that kind of book. He reminds us that love is an action verb, not a sentiment; love is a firm commitment to act for the well-being of someone other than yourself; love moves us from "me" to "we". Though it may be hard work at times, it is the one and only hope for making this world a better place.



The "love chapter" of the Bible, I Corinthians 13, has been read at countless weddings to dewy-eyed brides and grooms, but Paul was not writing to two people committed to sharing life together. He was writing to a church whose members were fighting tooth and nail with each other! He was reminding them of Jesus' example of selfless living and his admonition that others would be able to identify his followers by the love that they showed to each other and the world. The opposite of love isn't hate, but selfishness.

Bishop Curry has spent a lifetime advocating, practicing, living, and preaching love. He isn't naive about living with love as your driving force. He knows changing ourselves and our communities for the better may not be easy, or quick, or comfortable, or even popular, but he knows it is worth every ounce of effort. "The struggle is worth waging because it is for the good. And the good is born of God. And in the end, nothing can stop God." This is just one of dozens of passages I underlined while reading this book.

The book does more than simply talk about living a life of love. The final few pages offer a process we can each use to grow closer to God, the source of all love. As we grow into the loving people God intends us to be, our relationships, our communities, and our churches will all benefit from the "love that will not let me go."
